1. What are Cookies?

- 1.1 Cookies are small text files that are stored on your computer or other device when you visit our website. Cookies allow our website to store information as you navigate web pages.
- 1.2 All of the cookies used by us are safe, and they do not contain malware or viruses, for your devices and they only store information that is used by the browser.
- 1.3 These cookies cannot be used to access content on your computer and cannot execute code and.
- 1.4 You can choose to accept or decline cookies. This may however prevent you from taking full advantage of our website.
- 1.5 We use 2 broad categories of cookies:
 - a. Session cookies: these cookies are deleted when you close your browser
 - b. Persistent cookies: These stay on your device until you delete them, or they expire, and enable our website to remember you as a returning visitor. These can be useful to improve your browsing experience.
- 1.6 Some cookies are essential to ensure the proper functioning of our website. This includes maintaining online security and recording your preferences regarding cookies settings relating to our website. These cookies will continue to be used even if you select No to the cookies option when you visit the website. You can delete these cookies by clearing the cache on your device however if you do this we will not remember your cookie selection and you will be treated as a new user when you next visit our website.

2. How we use cookies

- 2.1 We use cookies to distinguish you from other users of our website. This helps us analyse statistical data about our webpage traffic and monitor individual tracking data to improve our website in order to tailor it to visitor needs. We may use cookies and an IP tracking code to collect data.
- 2.2 Overall, cookies help us provide you with a better website, by enabling us to monitor which pages you find useful and which you do not. A cookie in no way gives us access to your computer or any information about you, other than the data you choose to share with us.

3. What cookies do we use?

- 2.3 We use the following cookies:
 - a. **Performance cookies** – We use these cookies to measure how visitors use our website, through Google Analytics, such as no. of visitors, time spent and where visitors have come from (entry point into website). This information is stored (anonymously) and allows us to identify ways to improve our website.
 - b. **Functionality cookies** – we use these cookies to recognise you when you return to our website.
 - c. **Targeting cookies** – we use these cookies to record your visit to our website, the pages you have visited and the links you have followed. We may use this information to enhance our website.
